



In the heart of Austin's Zilker neighborhood, a deep narrow site culminates in a 35-foot drop into a wide urban stream, setting the stage for the Kinney Residence. The residence consists of a guest apartment over a covered carport, a welcoming forecourt space, and the main residence itself which overlooks the wildness of the stream banks.

The transparent public side of the main residence is designed to visually engage the forecourt space used for family games and large outdoor gatherings. As you step into the main public areas on the upper floor, you immediately notice how light and fresh air fill the space, thanks to a row of windows above eye level. These special windows are positioned along a central spine that runs through the home, drawing attention to the stunning view of the deep ravine at the rear. The private bedrooms on the main and lower levels, a small spa/plunge pool, and a screened porch all have access to stream views, allowing residents to fully immerse themselves in their surroundings.

The Kinney Residence tastefully blends design and nature to create an inviting space in the heart of the city.



Hood House, located in West Lake Hills, is an intriguing renovation and addition project. The existing mid-century home has been carefully renovated, seamlessly integrating a two-story addition that features a primary suite and a second living space. Working in harmony, the new addition and original house frame the charming backyard, creating an intimate oasis around the newly constructed pool.

Preserving the post and beam structure of the original house, as well as its striking limestone fireplace, was a priority. Partitions were removed to create a spacious, open living space, enhancing the sense of flow and connectivity.

Sustainability is central to the design. The addition's roof efficiently channels all water to a single collection point, while solar panels are situated on the south-facing roofs to harness renewable energy.


While the renovation maintains a discreet appearance from the street with minimal changes to the front of the house, a subtle split-level addition at the back can be seen above the original roofline. This design approach preserves the mid-century aesthetic while providing updated spaces tailored for a growing family. Hood House offers a welcoming sanctuary that seamlessly combines contemporary features with timeless charm.



Inspired by the shapes and curled edges of falling oak leaves, Bercy Chen Studio incorporated this imagery as a design motif for a series of sheltering pavilion roofs.

The property is a wilderness of cedars, oaks, mule deer, and the endangered Golden-cheeked Warbler. Positioned at the edge of limestone cliffs above a bend in the stream, the house nestles into the landscape.

Three glass pavilions step down the plateau with a bold slice in the hillside. A meandering drive traces the topography to preserve most of the site as a dedicated natural habitat. The home unfolds beneath the carport, with each pavilion having its own character and orientation.


The living wing extends into the tree canopy, while the bedroom wing contrasts an opaque circulation spine with expansive glass walls. The pool house, perched on the cliff, features a lap pool above cascading rapids.

At the heart of the design, an outdoor courtyard and fire pit encircle an existing limestone boulder. Here, the family can experience the four elements of nature that bind the home together—earth, wind, water, and fire.

Two decades ago, Furman + Keil was asked to design a new house on the site where Roessner's two previous models once stood. Though lacking a stable foundation, the 1960s houses served as a profound inspiration for Furman + Keil, leading to their own remarkable design showcased in the 2002 AIA Homes Tour.

Fast forward 20 years: the current owners hired the firm once again to remodel and expand upon their original work. The architects were tasked with bringing the house into the 21st century while preserving the architectural language established in the initial design.


The home now boasts additional primary bedrooms, a new studio, and reconfigured spaces. Every aspect of the house has been carefully updated, from new finishes, cabinetry, and fixtures. These changes honor the existing exposed structure, embracing its rigorous aesthetic and rhythmic flow from inside to outside and back in again.

The Foothill Terrace residence is a testament to the harmonious blend of architectural legacies, where the spirit of Roessner's past work intertwines with Furman + Keil's contemporary vision, resulting in a home that embodies both history and modernity.


The Descendant House encompasses three distinct family units, for grandparents, parents, and children. The design ensures that while each unit enjoys their individual space, they remain interconnected through shared cooking and gathering areas that serve as the heart of the home. At the core of this remarkable space is the kitchen, a space of utmost importance to this family, where they bond over a love for food, cooking, gardening, and beekeeping—which takes place in the outdoor garden.

The design concept revolves around four primary materials: masonry, wood, glass, and stucco. Each material serves a specific purpose tailored to the unique identities within the household, and establishes a distinct relationship with the site. This intentional composition of volumes facilitates both the independence and interconnection of the family members.

Descendant House embodies the values of privacy, shared experiences, and connection to nature, serving as a testament to the power of architecture in facilitating a harmonious and dynamic coexistence for the family who calls it home.

Structural Engineer Steinman Luevano Structures 512.891.6766 slstructures.com Homeowner, Joey Neugart and architect, Sarah Bullock McIntyre, met in college 20 years ago and remained friends. Neugart and his family were eager to return to Austin following a decade in the Bay Area. With Bullock's help, they purchased a pier and beam cottage, sight-unseen, in family-friendly, centrally located Rosedale. While the remodeling plans initially aimed for expansion, it was quickly determined to be cost-prohibitive.

Given the chance to start fresh, the owners prioritized an efficient, thoughtful layout with views of the backyard and street, natural light, and minimalist, "hygge" detailing. They requested a low-sloped gable roof reminiscent of the midcentury houses they loved in California, and a perched front porch for neighbor engagement.

Finally, they wanted a carport worthy of their 1966 Fiat 600D, "Blue Baby". The small lot size, significant grade change, and an existing 295-square-foot detached studio influenced the split-level layout and footprint. The Shoalwood Residence stands as a testament to the shared vision of homeowners and architect joining forces to create a home that embodies comfort, elegance, and a strong sense of community.

As part of a multi-year research and design process, homeowner Greg Esparza, in collaboration with Moontower, commissioned and built a studio for his family to explore what happens if the climate is put first when designing a home.

The result: a 2 bed, 2 bath home built entirely from plant-based materials, resulting in zero carbon emissions. The experimental structure, built of cross laminated timber panels and thermally modified cork is unconventional, naturally. It looks different, it smells different, sounds different carpenters even say the saw dust tastes different!

See what a home can be with no concrete above grade, no gypsum wallboard, no cementitious siding, stucco, or mortar, and no petroleum-based insulation. The Cross Cabin is a laboratory for change that is transforming the day-to-day practice of architecture to achieve a zero carbon, equitable, resilient, and naturally-built environment.



Doors <u>Windsor Windows & Doors</u> 512.251.3457 windsorwindows.com At The Perch, a 660-square-foot flexible studio space is shaped to fit above the existing bungalow roofline and within the City of Austin's building parameters. The owners had a clear goal in mind: to preserve their backyard and avoid the need to relocate during construction, all while ensuring the mature landscape remained undisturbed. Thus, The Perch was born.


Rooms have small footprints and vaulted ceilings for added volume, and the split-level form provides concealed storage and mechanical space throughout. The Perch rests on four steel columns, piercing through existing bungalow walls to resist lateral forces.

The siding is constructed from corrugated corten steel due to its low maintenance qualities and to match existing site elements. The open grate with expanded metal stair shares a landing with the bungalow and is barefoot (and paw) friendly. A restrained, yet playful, material and color palette are carefully detailed with efficiency, economy, and serenity in mind.

The cantilevered form of the studio gently sways in the wind, a reminder of its construction.

light, and space can be directed and shaped into beautiful environments that function for your needs, comfort, and wellbeing. And they do it within the boundaries of budget and context.


